#### **Erntedankfest**

**Erntedankfest**, the German harvest Thanksgiving celebration will be celebrated again with the DSB Singers on Sunday, October 6, at 3:00 p.m. The program will take place first at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Newark with a Thanksgiving service conducted by Pastor Johnson, and participation of the DSB Singers, the Johannes Brass, our pianist, and St. Paul's organist.

Everyone is invited and welcome to bring friends. After the service, join us at the harvest supper served at the club in the Deutsche Halle. A prerequisite or obligation for the dinner is attendance at the church service at St. Paul's. Parking in front of the church entrance is free and plentiful. The distance between the church and DSB is less than 4 miles or about 10 minutes away.

#### German Language Adult Classes begin weekly on the following dates:

- Tues., October 1: Intermediate German with Iris Busch at 7:00 p.m. in the Library.
- Wed., October 16: **Beginning German** with Piper Wissinger at 7:30 p.m. in the Library.
- Thurs., October 17: Advanced German with Alison Matsen at 7:30 p.m. in the Library.

All classes are free to all DSB members, but attendance at these classes should be as consistent as possible to get the most out of the classes. No pre-registration is necessary. Just show up. You may try out all 3 classes to determine your best level. Below is a synopsis of what you will learn in each class:

**Beginner Class:** Beginners should be for people who have had no German, or maybe a year way back in high school, or just know a few phrases. You would start with the alphabet, colors, months, seasons, and numbers and then slowly build a basic vocabulary and simple sentences.

**Intermediate Class:** This class is meant for learners who have a basic level of proficiency and who can already function in uncomplicated communicative situations. Focus will be given the improving oral skills through constant interaction with others. There will be short readings that will help increase vocabulary and familiarity with grammatical structures.

**Advanced Class:** Advanced classes would be for people who recognize all the previously mentioned things but need practice in formulating their own sentences using the passive, subjunctive, etc., and things like adjective endings. Articles from magazines and newspapers will be used as teaching aids to better understand sentence structure as well as a more comprehensive vocabulary.

Die Kettner Briefe, a newly donated book to the **DSB Library**, contains letters written by Franz Kettner and his father, Dr. Franz Lambert Kettner, between 1850 and 1875. Franz, forced to leave his home in Germany, immigrated to Gillespie County, Texas, in 1848. His letters give first-hand accounts of life and events in Texas hill country and tell of the difficulties building a new way of life on a landscape very different from the one he left behind. Similarly, letters written by Dr. Kettner, a physician in Oberkirch, Baden, tell of life there during the mid-to-late 1800s. Letters and captions for the numerous photographs and maps appear in both English and German. For those members with an interest in American history, the book is well-worth reading.


