Trudy was nominated and received this award based on her profound impact in preserving the German heritage and language as well as celebrating the traditions and culture which we all share and that bring us all together.

Congratulations Edeltraut “Trudy” Gilgenast on receiving this most prestigious award.

Trudy has been a member of the DSB for virtually her entire life. She isn't simply a member of the club; the club is truly part of who she is. It lives in her spirit, her commitment, and everything she does.

Trudy, thank you for all you've done and thank you for letting us all be a part of it.


